Stage 5 Mandatory NESA Requirements

- > **English, Mathematics and Science** in Years 7, 8, 9 and 10. By the end of Year 10 all students must complete 400 hours in each of these subjects.
- > Human Society and Its Environment (HSIE) In Stage 5 (Years 9–10) all students study 100 hours each of Australian History and Australian Geography. (Humanities and Social Science)
- > Personal Development, Health and Physical Education (PDHPE) All students study PDHPE in Years 7, 8, 9 and 10. By the end of Year 10 all students must complete 300 hours of PDHPE.
- → A minimum of 1 elective study of 200 hrs.

NESA requires all students completing a HSC to demonstrate the ability to meet a minimum standard in Literacy and Numeracy.

All MHS students will have scheduled opportunities to undertake mandatory online testing during Year 10.



- · 2 units of English mandatory
- · No more than 7 units of Science courses
- Minimum 10 units of HSC study
- At MHS we expect all students to present a minimum of 12 Units for the HSC (2 Accelerated HSC 2023 + 10 studied HSC 2024)

High Quality Overall Achievements

- 9 students in 2020 achieved an ATAR above 99

Scaling

The scaling process is designed to encourage students to take the courses for which they are best suited and which best prepare them for their future studies. The underlying principle is that a student should neither be advantaged nor disadvantaged by choosing one HSC course over another.




☐ Once complete, student selections need to be printed and require a parent signature before being placed in the box outside Mr Horrell's office by Friday 6th August 2021.



Students will receive an email with the link to their online Subject Selection form https://spring.edval.education/login, along with a personal webcode to lodge their selections.


All Year 9 students will need to select an Accelerated subject as preference 1, their current 200Hr elective and a reserve Accelerated subject as their second preference.
