P&C Special Meeting Thursday 17th September



Year 12 have commenced their final month at school after completing their Trial exams. I am so very proud of the resilience demonstrated by our cohort, the way they continue to be engaged in their learning and their dedication to their studies. This week I met with Year 12 to discuss their final weeks of school, the start of Term 4 and the lead up to their HSC exams.

The restrictions currently in place from the NSW Government will determine many of the things we are able to do as we move forward. I have asked Year 12 to liaise with their Captains and we will make decisions, within Government restrictions and Department guidelines, as to what the last week of this term will look like.

We will hold a Year 12 Assembly on the last day, followed by morning tea with staff. As I explained to Year 12, the assembly can go for up to an hour and it is the recognition of each student and the acknowledgement of their achievements over the past six years that we would like to honour. After the assembly Year 12 will move out onto the ovals for morning tea with school staff, with individually packaged food to meet the restriction requirements. The assembly will be livestreamed to parents and the PowerPoint presentation outlining each student's achievements will be emailed to parents before the commencement of the assembly for their information.

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The Monday and Tuesday of the last week will see students wear their pyjamas to school on the Monday and another school's school uniform on the Tuesday. The captains and I will discuss any other activities that our Year 12 students suggest and see whether they fit within the guidelines set down by the Department. We hope to be able to plan some activities after the HSC is completed to celebrate with Year 12 their thirteen years of schooling. Hopefully we will be able to involve parents at that time.

While many students now have six weeks to prepare for their final written exams the HSC exams are underway for some students who are completing their performance, oral language exams and major projects over the next few weeks. I wish all the students well as they undertake these exams.

I would like to remind all of Year 12 and their parents that HSC students can have their COVID-19 test results fast tracked to reduce disruption to their studies and exams. Students just need to say they are an HSC student when taking the test.

Last week was SASS Recognition week and it was great to see so many staff take the time out to thank our SAS staff for their support in achieving what we do each and every day. Our school administration and support staff work tirelessly to support the many programs we run across the school. The front office staff are the face of our school and the feedback I receive from parents is how welcoming and helpful they are. From the library, to the science labs, the kitchens and grounds, our school is well supported by the support staff in each of these areas. While we take the time out each year to say thank you I know that the school community is thankful for the work they do each day.

As I write this, I acknowledge this is my last Bulletin article and that in three weeks I finish my role as Principal of Merewether High School. I would like to take this opportunity to thank the many students, staff, parents and community members who have made this role the best I have held in my thirty-eight years with the Department of Education. Schools are about people and it is the relationships I have developed during that time and in particular the amazing young men and women I have had the privilege of working with, the dedicated staff I have led during my time here and the highly engaged parents and community who have made this school what it is, that are the most memorable for me. People can talk about the "fake grass", the changes to curriculum, the clear processes we have implemented, the building projects or the continual improvements to the school as a whole, but it is the people that have made my job so enjoyable. When I say it has been a privilege to be the Principal of this school I mean it and I would like to say thank you to everyone for making it so.

On the 12th October I commence nine terms of long service leave and my official retirement date is the 31st January 2023. I have though relinquished my position so the school is able to continue to move forward with a new Principal. It is public knowledge that the Principal's position was advertised a number of weeks ago but no applicant was found eligible. As a result, the position has been readvertised this week and will close on the 16th September. When we are notified of the successful applicant, we will let the school community know.
