#### **Principal's Message**

Dear Parents

We had another fantastic *POSH Concert* at the Newcastle Conservatorium of Music on Thursday 26<sup>th</sup> August with a program packed full of amazing talent by our music students. The concert provided our Year 12 students with an excellent opportunity to practice their HSC performances before their final practical exam. Those of you who attended the concert will agree with me when I say that the standard of our students was outstanding. Congratulations to all the students who performed on the night and a huge thank you to the music staff who organised the evening.

It was good to see so many Year 10 students and their parents at our *Subject Selection Information Night* on Tuesday 24<sup>th</sup> August. Students and parents had the opportunity to ask staff questions regarding the various senior courses that will be offered at Merewether High for 2011. Mr Muddle also provided a comprehensive presentation of important points needed to be understood about the senior curriculum. It was most enjoyable to meet with parents and hear how their children's plans were going for their HSC pattern of study.

We also had many in attendance at our recent Year 8 *Parent and Student Information Night* last Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> September. 
