As I write this, the advice from the Department and Government is as follows - All school incursions currently remain on hold across the state. There should be no visitors to school sites unless they are essential, such as departmental staff (Directors Educational Leadership, Executive Directors School Performance, school services and itinerant support staff), allied health providers, wellbeing and case management professionals, maintenance providers and final year teaching practicum students.

Whilst we have returned to school, we continue to follow the restrictions put in place by the government and the advice of the Departments of Health and Education. As new advice comes to hand I will let you know what this means for us as we move forward. Due to the current restrictions, a number of events on our calendar, including teacher parent interviews, are on hold. As always, if you have any concerns as to your child please contact their class teacher, the relevant Head Teacher, the Year Adviser or the Deputy Principal to discuss any aspects of your child's education or wellbeing. Pedestrian Safety

Several parents and community members have phoned to inform us that some students are not aware when using the pedestrian crossing at the front of the school.

With mobile phones and ear buds an essential part of most adolescents' lives, can we take a moment to remind students of the pedestrian safety message below.



More than 1500 pedestrians are hit on NSW roads each year. Even if you are familiar with the road, it's vital to take an extra moment to look out before you step out, and always choose the safest place and time to cross.

It is easy to become complacent about safety, especially on a familiar route such as on your way to or from work. Taking risks and not being mindful on the roads can have serious consequences. It is important to have your head in the moment and make safe decisions when crossing the road.

Minimum standards

From 2020, students in NSW will need to demonstrate a minimum standard of literacy and numeracy to receive their HSC. At MHS we implement our minimum standards tests in Year 10. Students will be participating in the literacy, numeracy and writing tests on Thursday 25th and Friday 26th June 2020. COMEDY FOR A CAUSE

The Comedy For A Cause night, which was to be held on Friday 13th March, had to be postponed at the commencement of the Covid-19 crisis. We hope to reschedule it for later this year or early 2021 and will share details as they become available.

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The last few months has seen a greater emphasis on good personal hygiene, particularly hand washing and sanitising. Proper hand hygiene is critical to stop the spread of diseases, bacteria and germs.

Despite the importance of hand hygiene, particularly now, there are still so many people who don't wash or sanitise their hands properly. Our Hospitality students have recently participated in a lesson on hand hygiene using GlitterBug hand hygiene training products which are invisible to the naked eye but glow under UV light.

The students were able to see quite clearly the parts on the hand which were not washed or sanitised properly. In the majority of cases this is around the nail beds, under the nails, the webbing between fingers and around the wrists. Even students who thoroughly washed or sanitised their hands were surprised to see the results.



For the photos below using the hand washing solution, we shouldn't be able to see any of the product remaining.





These photos are for the hand sanitiser. We should be able to see a lot of the product on the hands in this situation as it indicates that all parts of the hand have been properly sanitised.





This activity proved to be a valuable learning experience about the correct techniques needed to ensure safe hand hygiene.

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Textiles Technology

It has been a big couple of months for the Year 12 and Year 9 Textile Technology classes. In March we went to Zig Zag Sewing in Waratah so that we could get a demonstration of how to use our new Pfaff Creative sewing machine. Senior students are now able to link their own embroidery designs to the sewing machine.



Both Year 12 and Year 9 travelled to Sydney to view the top HSC Textiles students display, TEXSTYLE. Students were able to analyse the top 10 articles in a variety of context areas and their accompanying portfolio.



The Textiles room has been getting refurbished over the last couple of months. We are very excited to have new tables, cupboards and boards that will allow students more space to showcase their creativity.

Music

Music students have been adapting to the enormous changes to online learning with great enthusiasm and creativity. They have created music using a range of available music technology to explore composition, performance and listening activities. Years 7 and 8 have been demonstrating their skills and coordination by submitting videos of body percussion and performances, some of which have been stitched to create a virtual ensemble. A wide variety of instrumental videos and creative compositions have been submitted throughout the learning from home experience.

Students from the Concert Band have been utilising a free membership with Smart Music, where they can access band charts and use computer microphones to play along and receive feedback on their progress. Vocal ensemble students have been encouraged to participate in the composer Eric Whitacre's Virtual Choir. Over 17,000 singers from across the world have submitted videos of themselves singing the premiere of a new choral work, *Sing Gently*.

Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the *NCCD guidelines* (2019).

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- year of schooling
- category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information. NSW Health is ensuring that students are safely vaccinated at school during COVID-19

Information for parents/guardians

NSW Health has been working with education authorities to implement additional measures to ensure that students in Year 7 and 10 can be safely vaccinated during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Program background

In 2020 NSW Health is offering the following vaccines:

YEAR	VACCINE	NUMBER OF DOSES
Year 7	Human papillomavirus (HPV)	2 doses at least 6 months apart
rear /	Diphtheria, Tetanus and Pertussis (dTpa)	1 dose
Year 10	Meningococcal ACWY	1 dose

While the school vaccination program has been disrupted due to low student attendance, students are progressively returning to school over the coming months.

Additional measures

NSW Health has implemented additional measures based on expert clinical advice to reduce the likelihood of COVID-19 transmission in school clinics, including:

- health screening of nurses before clinics
- pre-vaccination screening of students
- physical distancing restrictions at the clinic entrance & observation area
- ensuring the number of students and nurses at the clinic does not exceed the maximum allowed
- enhanced hand hygiene by nurses and students
- enhanced environmental cleaning of all surfaces

What parents/guardians should do

Parents/guardians should ensure that students with influenza-like symptoms do not attend school and are tested as soon as possible (www.nsw.gov.au/covid-19/symptoms-and-testing). There is no need for parents/guardians who have given consent for their child to receive vaccinations at school to take any action. Parents/guardians who have not provided consent can contact their local public health unit on 1300 066 055 or their school for advice on how to provide consent for vaccination.

When students will be vaccinated

Public health units are arranging clinics with schools so that vaccinations can be given to students as soon as possible.
